

## Scranton Public Library 3D Printing Pricing Policy

The Scranton Public Library offers a 3D Printing service through its Technology Lab and in collaboration with its Maker Space program. The printer is maintained and operated by a member of the Digital Services staff. For a small cost, patrons may submit files to be printed using our machine, a Cura LulzBot TAZ 6. Print jobs are limited to the size of the machine's print bed, our ability to open and process files submitted for printing, and the available quantity and colors of filament stocked by the Technology Lab. The cost of this service helps us maintain our supply of filament and keep the printer in working order.

## Pricing for print jobs is as follows:

- \$2 for basic print jobs up to and including 1 hour of total print time.
- \$1 for each additional hour of print lab after the initial hour.
  - o For example, a job that takes 3 hours total to complete will cost \$4: \$2 for the first hour and \$1 each for the second and third hours.
- If multiple files are submitted for printing at one time, they will be considered separate jobs unless the files are all to printed with one single color filament and as long as all submitted files can be contained within the area of the print bed.
  - o For example, if two files that need to be assembled after printing are requested where one piece needs to be black and one piece needs to be white, this will be considered two individual print jobs. If both pieces are requested in black and can be printed on the print bed concurrently, it will be considered one print job.
- Patrons will not be required to pay for print jobs that are unsuccessful or that we are unable to complete due to a restriction of our equipment or malfunction that occurs during printing.

By participating in this service, the patron acknowledges their responsibility in complying with copyright and intellectual property laws and regulations. We expect that any file submitted for printing has been obtained legally through an open-source online platform or has been designed by them or an independent third-party that has been appropriately compensated. The library does not offer an independent design service but can direct patrons to online resources if needed.
